I certify that I have completed the audit of the Annual Return for the year ended 31 March 2023 of **Seven Sisters Community Council**. Audit opinion: Qualified

Except for the matters reported below in my Basis for Qualification, on the basis of my audit, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention to give cause for concern that, in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislative and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.

Basis of Qualification

Annual Governance Statement

In my opinion, the Annual Governance Statement is not consistent with the Council's internal controls and governance arrangements for the year:

Members Allowances

The Council does not pay members allowances as required under the Independent Remuneration Panel Report and determinations. It appears that this is a Council policy. However, the Council must make arrangements for the payment of a basic allowance of £150 each year to all members. If individual members do now wish to receive the allowance they must write to the Clerk stating this. The Council must not as a corporate body determine that individual members will not receive allowances
